Timeline

April 26, 2022 – Approval by City Council

May 4, 2022 – Window for applications opens
(remains open until funds fully allocated)

On a monthly basis, Allied Arts presents the City with requests for approval. After City approval, Allied Arts distributes grant awards.

Eligibility

The non-profit is a 501 (c)(3) or 501 (c)(19); and

The non-profit is an Oklahoma City arts or cultural non-profit (headquartered in OKC); and

The non-profit must be established and functioning at the time of the application and for at least the three years prior to its submission of its application for funds; and

The non-profit must have current financials and an active, volunteer board of directors; and

The non-profit is registered as a charitable organization with the State of Oklahoma; and

Eligibility

The non-profit is self-identified as “Arts, Culture, and Humanities”; and

The non-profit has experienced “negative impact” or damages due to the COVID–19 public health emergency; and

This can be shown through decreased revenue or gross receipts (relative to pre-pandemic revenue), increased costs due to COVID, COVID mitigation measures taken (excluding facility expansion), or challenges covering payroll, rent or mortgage, or other operating costs; and

The negative impact was experienced during the period beginning March 3, 2021 and ending December 31, 2024.

Requests

- Non-profit with budget of \$100,000 or less can receive up to 50% of its organizational budget
- Non-profit with budget between \$101,000 and \$500,000 can receive up to 20% of its organization budget
- Non-profit with budget between \$501,000 and \$1,000,000 can receive up to 10% of its organization budget
- Non-profit with budget more than \$1 million can receive up to 5% of its organization budget.
